Its role was to ensure that members of the rural community living in more remote areas were given a guaranteed date and time when officers would be available to discuss any problems or concerns that they had.

In an effort to improve this service, this role has now been given to each individual beat manager who now has responsibility for setting up a number of engagements each month within their beat management areas.

Last week I also sent out an extra page which highlighted the diary of community engagement events across all beats for the month of May. I plan to send this out at the beginning of each month to ensure all villages know when their local officer or PCSO will be attending.

If you have any specific events or meetings that you would like your beat manager to attend then please make contact with them and provided they are given enough notice, they will make every effort to attend.
