Are you eligible for free energy saving home improvements?

The Affordable Warmth Network, supported by local authorities in Bucks and Oxon¹, has secured funding which could help you with the cost of making energy saving home improvements. You may be eligible for a free boiler upgrade, free home insulation or even, in certain circumstances, replacement windows and doors. Boilers account for about 55 per cent of what you spend in a year on energy bills², so an efficient boiler makes a big difference.

You could qualify for a grant if:

- You own your home, or you rent your home from a private landlord and
- You receive certain means tested benefits, tax or pension credits or
- Someone in your household has a respiratory or cardiovascular health condition made worse by living in a cold or damp home.
