- 67 people in total completed the survey
- 44 from Hurstbourne Tarrant
- 19 from Ibthorpe
- 3 from Upton

- 19-30 years old - 0 participants
- 31-50 years old – 22 participants
- 51-75 years old – 32 participants

Were the services that consistently scored poorly in the survey.

The biggest issues.....



What has attracted the most comment/concern?

- Road safety/speeding traffic and HGVs - Scored 39 comments/concerns
- The focus on the safer route to school –A343 crossing point which is a concern for school children, parents, elderly and disabled residents - Scored 17 comments/concerns
- Dog fouling - Scored 12 comments/concerns

What has the Parish Council been asked to address?

- Road safety
- Littering and dog fouling – continue the pilot dog and Sparkle Day schemes with TVBC
- Levelling the playing fields and expanding sports playing facilities
- Continue to improve and maintain play areas and play equipment
- Parking in Church St and replacement of railings
- Footpath maintenance needs joint working by HCC/HbT PC/volunteers and landowners
- Consider a more formal link with the Royal British Legion

What do we need HCC to focus their efforts on?

- Lobbying for improved Broadband and Mobile phone services
- HCC highways continued support in addressing road safety issues and improvements.
- Improving bus services – early morning run and late night service to villages around Andover particularly on Friday/Saturday night. Cango service is an essential service to all non-car users.
- Mobile library is considered a small gem amongst elderly and disabled residents
- Providing information and details on local grant opportunities and support for our applications

What do we need TVBC to focus their efforts on?

- Continue the pilot responsible dog ownership Scheme
- Repeat the parish ‘Sparkle Days’
- Support the provision of late night Friday/Saturday bus service from Andover to the surrounding villages
- Support rural policing and Neighbour Watch initiatives in the Bourne Valley
- Maintain support on any planning matters and represent our planning application concerns
- Champion local/affordable housing need for parish residents
- Providing information and details on local grant opportunities and support for our applications

Potential Opportunities for Joint Working with other agencies and Parishes ?

Rural parishes around Andover/TVBC

- Late night Friday/Saturday bus run
- Rural policing and Neighbourhood Watch

Bourne Valley parishes

- Flood prevention and mitigation

Highclere, Ashmansworth, Hurstbourne Tarrant and Enham Alamein Parish Councils

- Jointly lobbying on A343 road safety management and initiatives

What are voluntary groups being asked to consider?

- More of the same - Footpath clearance, litter picking, volunteer drivers etc
- Re-invigorate Neighbourhood Watch groups and active links with local policing
- Facilitate 'Social Clubs' to provide support and contact for two groups the elderly residents and teenage residents
