Notes for editors:

1. Savings are based on a gas heated three bedroom semi-detached house without any loft insulation. Topping up existing loft insulation to 270mm (10.5 inches) usually saves around £60 a year. If your property is larger than average for the number of bedrooms, or access is difficult, you may have to pay more.
2. Cocoon is a free, independent, comparison service established since 2003. It is being promoted by local authorities across Buckinghamshire, Bedfordshire, Berkshire, Oxfordshire and Hertfordshire and is now available in Hampshire.
